


HISTORICAL BACKGROUND (DISCUSS IMPORTANT PERSONS AND EVENTS ASSOCIATED WITH THIS STRUCTURE): The 1905 city directory indicates that this was the home of W.N. Sargent, a hay dealer. The 1920 U.S. Census indicates that this house was owned by 74-year-old Elinor Linkhart, who lived here with her son, Rodney. Mr. Linkhart worked on a cattle ranch. In 1932, this was the home of John F. and Ellen Jones. Mr. Jones worked for the Denver Mutual Water Works. In 1939, this was the rented home of Harold and Isabell Huron. Faith Stevenson has lived here for many years.
